



Rescue Laser Flares brings safety at sea into the 21st Century

Rescue Laser Flares look like typical small handheld flashlight, but produces a line of laser light intended for signalling during search and rescue operations. One of the outstanding benefits of these flares are they are battery operated, on two AA batteries lasting up to 2400 times longer than existing pyrotechnic flares.

They can be seen up to 32 kilometres away at night and somewhere between one and 4 kilometres in daylight. They are waterproof up to 80 feet, so there's no problem keeping one in a wet dinghy or attached to a life jacket. They can also be used to detect reflective material on life jackets and channel markers.

In open waters, one can signal help for the light time with 72 hours. Just twist the laser on and use the aiming ring to hit your target. At 25 kilometres, it will throw a 6,000-foot spray of light, making it hard to miss. This is the innovation that separates this product from the typical laser pointer.

Best of all, Rescue Lasers are environmentally safe and there is no fire hazard. They are not a hazardous to keep on a plane or boat. Rescue Lasers have been sold throughout the world since 2001 and never had a safety issue.
